Board President Ryan Clausnitzer called the regularly scheduled Board meeting to order at 5:00 PM.

All Trustees were present for the Board meeting. Trustee Doggett arrived at 5:08 PM, and Trustee Donahue arrived at 5:20 PM.

President Clausnitzer invited members of the public to speak on issues relevant to the District. Retired Trustee Barbara Halliday introduced the new Trustee representing the City of Hayward, Elisa Marquez. Mayor Halliday thanked the Board for their dedication during her tenure as the representative from the City of Hayward and complimented the diligence of the trustees in overseeing ACMAD operations. Retired Trustee Jim Prola addressed the Board and introduced the new Trustee representing the City of San Leandro, Ursula Reed. Vice Major Prola also thanked the Board for their efforts and complimented the trustees for their excellent management of the financial resources of ACMAD.

The Board approved the minutes of the 1019^h meeting held March 11, 2015 (Narum/ Quinn – unanimous; Trustees Spinola, Dickinson, Reed and Marquez abstained).

President Clausnitzer presented Resolution 1019-1 honoring former Trustee Barbara Halliday for her work on the Board.

President Clausnitzer presented Resolution 1020-1 honoring former Trustee Jim Prola for his work on the Board.

The Board approved the Compensation Agreement from the Alameda County Redevelopment Successor Agency (Spinola/Reed - unanimous) .

The Board reviewed warrants dated March 15, 2015 numbering 046815 through 049215 amounting to \$100,956.82 and warrants dated March 31, 2015 numbering 049315 through 053115 amounting to \$206,077.28.

The Board reviewed Account Balances and revenues received as of March 31, 2015. Several trustees requested that the percentage of the fiscal year expended be added to future Account Balances reports.

District Manager Jan Washburn presented the Monthly Operational Report for March 2015. He noted that the number of service requests remained high both for ACMAD and other mosquito control districts in the Bay Area. The Manager described how service requests are categorized by mosquito species and other species of insect.

The District Manager presented the Monthly Manager's Report for March 2015.

- a. The Manager collected Form 700 on Economic Interest from Board members.
- b. The manager described the efficacy of the aerial treatment of Coyote Hills on March 26. Based on a reduction of larval mosquito populations, fewer service requests from the public and discussion with Coyote Hills personnel, the treatment was deemed successful.
- c. A court ruling has let stand the Santa Clara Mosquito and Vector Control District's fogging operations for control of West Nile virus vectors. The court found that the SCMVCD did not "trespass" while adulticiding and set aside a challenge to the CEQA documents filed by SCMVCD.
- d. Centimark Roofing Company will install a new roof on the mechanics shop in late April after the skylights are shipped to ACMAD.
- e. Environmental Specialist, Erika Castillo, will be completing the District's PEIR by the end of April and provide Trustees with copies if desired.
- f. The Manager reviewed the progress for the recruitment of a new IT person and an Assistant Mosquito Control Technician.
- g. The Manager reviewed the progress for the recruitment of a new District Manager.

h. The Manager presented the current status of committee assignments for the Board, indicating that new members would need to be appointed to replace trustees who have retired.

Trustees Clausnitzer and Guarienti reported on their attendance at the Alameda County Chapter of the California Special Districts Association annual dinner and 25th anniversary meeting in Pleasanton on March 26. Trustee Clausnitzer made a brief presentation on how the District operations have changed in 25 years; the main focus of the District now is control of larval mosquito populations using environmentally safe pesticides.

President Clausnitzer asked trustees if there were any items to be added to the agenda for the May 13, 2015 Board meeting. .

The meeting adjourned at 6:20 PM.

MONTHLY OPERATIONAL REPORT - April 2015

Dear Trustees:

I. NARRATIVE

The District received a total of 160 requests for service during April. There were 36 mosquito-biting reports. The ten-year average for service requests regarding mosquitoes in April is 33.7.

Larval control efforts in April were focused primarily on five species of mosquitoes: *Aedes dorsalis*, the summer saltmarsh mosquito; *Culiseta inornata*, the winter marsh mosquito; *Culex tarsalis*, the encephalitis mosquito; Culex *pipiens* the house mosquito; and *Culiseta incidens*, the fish pond mosquito.

The summer saltmarsh mosquito, Aedes dorsalis, breeds in tidal salt marsh areas that flood only during the highest tides of the month. This mosquito is a day biter that can be found in larger grassy areas like parks and school yards after the adults emerge and fly away from the salt marshes.

Culiseta inornata, the winter marsh mosquito, is found after the first rains in fall. The female mosquitoes over summer in protected sites that range from culvert pipes to gopher holes. After the first rains, these mosquitoes lay eggs in a wide range of sources from rain water pools to brackish marshes and will go through multiple cycles until the temperature warms in the spring. These large brown mosquitoes are usually found biting at dusk or on overcast days. There were 3 service requests attributed to adult *Cs. inornata* in April.

The fish pond mosquito, *Culiseta incidens*, is found throughout the year in Alameda County. This mosquito can utilize many different types of sources found around homes including fish ponds, fountains, bird baths, untreated swimming pools and pool covers, boats, spas, and many more. Mosquitofish were delivered to 84 local residents during the month. *Cs. incidens* larvae were found at 20 service requests during the month.

Culex tarsalis, the encephalitis mosquito, is a vector of West Nile virus as well as St. Louis and Western Equine Encephalitis. This mosquito is found in most areas of the county from February through October. The larvae are found in freshwater sources of all types. Cx. tarsalis was found at 3 service requests during the month.

Culex pipiens, the house mosquito, is a vector of West Nile virus and is found throughout the year in Alameda County with its peak populations occurring in summer and fall. The larvae are found in underground sources such as storm drains, catch basins, sumps and flooded basements as well as in water treatment plants. There were 8 service requests attributed to *Cx. pipiens* during the month.

Manager's Report

May 13, 2015

- a. Aedes aegypti: Two adult female mosquitoes, tentatively identified as Aedes aegypti were captured in an industrial area of Hayward on April 30 and May 1. This finding represents the first known record of this invasive mosquito in Alameda County. The appropriate State and County agencies were notified and emergency abatement and surveillance protocols were enacted. In its response, ACMAD followed the recommendations of the Response Plan to Invasive Aedes Species (June 2014) prepared by the California Department of Public Health. Staff met with representatives from CDPH at the District headquarters on May 8 to review ACMAD's response and future plans to address the problem. Both specimens were given to CDPA for DNA testing and verification.
- b. Capital Improvement of the District Headquarters: Centimark Roofing Company has almost finished installation of the new roof and skylights on the mechanic's shop. Installation should be completed within a week and has not interfered with our mosquito control operations. The project was delayed for two weeks to allow time for fabrication of the skylights.
- **c. Annual PEIR:** The District's PEIR is still in preparation, but should be completed by the end of May and will be available to Trustees prior to submission.
- d. Hiring of a New Assistant Mosquito Control Technician: The District has hired Jeremy Sette for the position of Assistant Mosquito Control Technician. Jeremy has worked for the past two summers as a seasonal employee of the San Mateo Mosquito and Vector Control District. He has completed parts A & B for certification and has prior experience with catch basin treatments and *Aedes aegypti* surveillance. Jeremy will begin working for the District on May 18.
